#### A MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

Friends,

It is with great honor and privilege that I became Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of St. Vincent Catholic Charities (STVCC) on May 1, 2023.

For the past 75 years, STVCC has been a pillar of strength and hope in our community with its notable programs and services: Refugee Services, Foster Care and Adoption, and their Immigration Law Clinic.

In addition to becoming the CEO of STVCC, I am also the CEO of Cristo Rey Community Center (CRCC) since 2013. CRCC offers safetynet services, including primary medical care, substance abuse disorder counseling, financial education services, a food pantry, a community kitchen, a clothing room, and a personal needs pantry.

I am humbled and passionate about leading both agencies, with over 120 years of combined experience assisting our community.

With this responsibility, I also want to acknowledge the many changes over the last year. Emotions have been widespread – including excitement, apprehension, and anticipation – from me, our staff, and our Board of Directors from STVCC and CRCC.

That said, I wanted to share a biblical passage with you that recently resonated with me and what I feel embodies the next steps for these agencies: "Grow in Grace and Knowledge" (2 Peter 3:18). While it's been a year of change, it's also been a year of growing in humility, grace, and knowledge.

It is my vision, along with the Board of Directors from STVCC and CRCC, that we lead the effort to officially combine agencies to create one cohesive Catholic agency to serve Lansing and greater Ingham, Eaton, and Clinton counties.

STVCC and CRCC's missions, visions, and values align with the common goal of Providing Help and Creating Hope. By joining into one Catholic agency, the combined organization will create an opportunity to serve more individuals and families seeking assistance with greater efficiency and effectiveness.

While there is no specific timeline, in the months to come, our STVCC and CRCC agencies will take steps to begin collaborating to enable our combined agency to expand the following services:

- · Expansion of the existing medical practice;
- · Opening of a dental practice;
- · Re-opening of the Children's Home under Cristo Rey Community Center

As we look forward to this collaborative effort, my focus and commitment will continue to provide life-changing services to our community through STVCC and CRCC. Both teams have already begun working together as a part of this thoughtful integration process.

I need to note that combining our two agencies will not happen overnight. Additionally, our names and branding will not change until all legal and regulatory requirements are complete.

I hope you join in celebration with me as we progress with this wonderful opportunity to grow in grace and knowledge to serve our community. I promise to keep you updated as the progression to expand our services occurs.

The languages reflected on the Peace Pole this year are English, Spanish, Ukrainian, Swahili, Arabic, French, Dari, Burmese, representing the languages spoken by the majority of STVCC's clients this year. Every year, STVCC's Refugee Services looks forward to recognizing the contribution of community partners by awarding a Peace Pole.

In celebration of World Refugee Awareness Week and World Refugee Day, STVCC dedicated their 2023 Peace Pole to The Davies Project for Mid-Michigan Children, led by Pamela Miklavcic, Founder and CEO of The Davies Project.

At the dedication ceremony, Veronika Parsamova, STVCC's Refugee Services Community Outreach Coordinator, began with an opening statement, followed with remarks by Ben Cabanaw, State Refugee Coordinator, Joe Garcia, STVCC and CRCC CEO, Pamela Miklavcic and Shukriah, a client of STVCC's Refugee Services and a new mother who benefited directly from the services provided by The Davies Project.

STVCC paid tribute towards The Davies Project and their dedicated volunteers for providing reliable, safe, and trustworthy transportation to their refugee families and, its especially noteworthy to mention, how The Davies Project assisted pregnant refugee women to and

from their medical appointments. The Davies Project undoubtedly stands by STVCC's mission to "welcome the stranger" and STVCC couldn't be more appreciative to Pam, her staff and their volunteers! The Davies Project has shown our newcomers a warm-hearted welcome as they have integrated into the Lansing community, and STVCC could not have thought of a more deserving agency to receive this year's 2023 Peace Pole.

"This is an organization whose volunteers help people in need get better access to medical services by transporting them for free," said Veronika. "It takes a village to raise a child. It takes a community, like Lansing, to show the great promise of the American dream. We continue to celebrate The Davies Project and their volunteers for their dedication and passion in supporting our mission."

Pamela remarked, "Receiving this year's Peace Pole from St. Vincent's Catholic Charities is a humbling recognition that carries with it a lot of weight and responsibility. On behalf of everyone who works for, or volunteers at, The Davies Project, and on behalf of the hundreds of families—including many refugee families—whose seriously ill children we serve with free rides to medical care, I offer my heartfelt thanks for this recognition.

We all have family histories—some known to us, some unknown—that have contributed to this messy yet lovely place we call home. Our country is a patchwork of ideas, beliefs and customs that make us truly unique and beautiful. It is why we must always welcome newcomers, just as our country welcomed our ancestors. We now join the Greater Lansing Food Bank, Lansing City Hall, St. Casimir Parish, the Department of Health and Human Services, and the Forest Community Health Center with Peace Poles awarded by STVCC. We join 200,000 other Peace Poles across the globe (in 200 countries). What a beautiful tradition, and a lovely way to spread peace and kindness," said Pam.

Mahatama Gandhi famously said, "The difference between what we do and what we are capable of doing would suffice to solve most of the world's problems." Welcoming faces and devoted hearts, as shown to us by The Davies Project, are doing just that – demonstrating just what we are capable of.
